This July 2011 issue marks the 18<sup>th</sup> anniversary of *JSE*, so I am very pleased to interview Jackie Dietz, the founding editor of *JSE* and a driving force behind its creation and the high quality that the *Journal* initiated in 1993 and has maintained since. I hope that you will learn some things you did not know about the early days of *JSE* as you read the interview, as well as becoming more acquainted with Jackie herself.
